SITREP One – USS Kansas City (LCS)



Join us December 17, 2020 at 6:30 pm for our next a virtual program on Zoom that features CDR Christopher Brusca, USN, Commanding Officer of the USS Kansas City.

USS Kansas City (LCS-22) is an Independence-class littoral combat ship of the United States Navy. She is the third ship to

be named for Kansas City. Kansas City was built in Mobile, Alabama by Austal USA. The ship was christened on 22 September 2018 in Mobile, Alabama, and sponsored by Tracy Davidson, wife of Admiral Philip S. Davidson. She was launched 19 October 2018 into the Mobile River. Kansas City was commissioned

on 20 June 2020[6] and she has been assigned to Littoral Combat Ship Squadron One.

CDR Brussca, A Pico Rivera, CA native, enlisted in the Navy after high school in 1993, as an Operations Specialist.



While serving aboard USS Vandergrift (FFG 48), he was accepted into the Broadened Opportunity for Officer Selection and Training (BOOST) Program. He graduated from the University of San Diego in 2000 with a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations. In 2006, he earned Master of Science in Global Leadership from the University of San Diego School of Business.

His sea tours include serving as propulsion officer aboard

USS Dubuque (LPD 8); fire control officer aboard USS Decatur (DDG 73); engineering officer for MCM Crew Fearless while embarked aboard USS Chief (MCM 14) and USS Ardent (MCM 12); engineering officer aboard USS Simpson (FFG 56); strike officer for Carrier Strike Group Nine; executive officer of USS Fort Worth (LCS 3) and commanding officer of USS Charleston (LCS 18). He has participated in deployed operations in the Western Pacific, Arabian Gulf, Horn of Africa and the Baltics, while participating in operations Desert Storm, Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom.

Care Packages for USS Kansas City Sailors

The Greater Kansas City Council - Navy League received an inquiry from Lynn Kingman of the Riverside United Methodist Church - Moline, IL back in November wanting to know of military members who would be appreciative of receiving morale booster packages and letters for the Christmas Holidays.

Thoughts immediately turned to the junior sailors of the newly commissioned USS Kansas City (LCS-22) home ported in San Diego as many of these sailors have not been able to see their families since March of this year.

Working with USS Kansas City, Command Senior Chief, David Hyatt, fifty-seven junior sailors were identified and preparations made for receiving and distributing the care packages and letters for these young men and women.
